On Thursday, October 3, 2024, the Foundation handed over school supplies to disabled pupils at the inclusive public school in Monavebe, in the Sangmélima district of Cameroon. This event underlines the Foundation's commitment to inclusion and education.

The ceremony, presided over by Sub-Prefect Daniel Arthur Obama, was attended by students, teachers, parents and foundation representatives. The school supplies, including bags, books, notebooks, pencils and pens, will play a vital role in helping students on their educational journey.



This initiative represents a significant step toward inclusive education by providing 69 students with essential materials and affirming that every child deserves equitable access to education.

From August 5 to 7, 2024, the Monavebe Inclusive Public School organized a seminar to strengthen teachers' capacities in supporting students with special educational needs (SEN).

This event, funded by the Foundation, began with a ceremony presided over by the Deputy Prefect of Sangmélima, Mr. Daniel Arthur Obama. Several notable figures, including Mr. Philémon Medou, the school's director, Mr. Albert Ngo'o Yang, the Divisional Delegate for Basic Education, and Mr. Philémon Essouma, the District Inspector, expressed their gratitude for the Foundation's support, represented by Mr. Simon Davy Abeba and Mrs. Sylvie Ntsama.





The training focused on the rights of people with disabilities, as well as an introduction to Braille and sign language, with the goal of better integrating students with disabilities into the educational system. Participants received certificates at the end of the seminar, marking an important step towards inclusive education.

Stephen Hawking: Strength Beyond Limits



Stephen Hawking, renowned theoretical physicist, is often hailed for revolutionary his contributions science. However, his story is also marked by his battle with amyotrophic sclerosis (ALS), neurodegenerative disease that has profoundly influenced his personal and professional life. This diagnosis, which could have broken her spirit, revealed an inner strength and resilience that inspire us deeply.

At the age of 21, Stephen Hawking received a devastating diagnosis: incurable disease. ALS. an Doctors gave him just two years to live, a terrifying prospect for someone who had only just begun to explore the mysteries of the universe. Rather than let this sentence get him down, Hawking defied medical predictions by living to his 76th birthday. His resilience and determination have been an inspiration to many.

As the disease progressively paralyzed his body, Hawking used sophisticated assistive technologies to overcome his limitations. Thanks to a voice synthesizer, developed in part by programmer Dennis Klatt, he was able to continue sharing his ideas with the world. This voice synthesizer, which became his iconic voice, was not just a technological tool but a symbol of his determination and unwavering desire to make his thoughts and discoveries heard, including his theories on black holes and Hawking radiation.


Hawking has become a symbol for those struggling with personal challenges, showing that even the most


By defying medical expectations and using the constraints imposed by his illness as a catalyst for his scientific achievements, he has left a lasting and inspiring legacy.
