

Our actions on the ground


From August 5 to 7, 2024, a capacity-building seminar for teachers at the Inclusive School of Monavebe (Cameroon, Southern Region) took place, focused on the pedagogical and didactic care of students with disabilities. The main objective was to equip teachers with the necessary tools for better supervision of students, with an emphasis on the use of sign language and Braille writing.

06 p a g e On October 3, 2024, school supplies were given to 71 students with disabilities at the Monavebe Inclusive School. Each child received a complete kit including books, notebooks, rulers, slates, pens, pencils, erasers and many other essential materials. This initiative aims to remove one of the main obstacles to their success: the lack of school supplies, which hinders their development and limits their chances of success in their educational journey.





Marinette, a brave 20-year-old girl with Down syndrome, faces many challenges related to her health, including eye problems, hearing loss, and dental concerns. Thanks to your generosity, we were able to take steps to finance her medical examinations and treatments, giving her a chance to improve her quality of life.





It was an extraordinary and unprecedented moment, because, in 10 years at the head of this establishment, it is the first time that we have received a donation of such magnitude, specially dedicated to children

We express our deep gratitude to the Foundation for this exceptional gesture. These donations have had an immediate impact on the teaching and learning process. The students were able to use their reading and math books, which greatly facilitated their learning. Teachers, on the other hand, have been able to work more effectively with adapted resources, making teaching more accessible for these children. Parents also played an important role in supporting their children at home, including helping them with the exercises given by the teachers.

Thanks to these tools, significant progress has been made. During the first term evaluations, 48 of the 71 students with disabilities passed, i.e. a success rate of 67.6%. This is a very
